CHECK-IN PROCEDURE:

When you arrive, the Housing & Residence Life Staff will be on hand to assist you to ensure a smooth move-in.

- Large rolling bins are provided, but they are shared between students.
- Bring your own cart or hand-truck to help move your things for a quicker check in process
- Pack belongings in boxes and other containers for easier transportation from car to room.
- Label all your belongings with your last name.
- Please bring a valid photo ID with you to expedite the process.
- Directly outside of the residence are city metered parking spaces. If you double park to unpack your belongings DO NOT leave your car unattended as you may be ticketed by the NYPD.
- Only on Tuesday, Aug 16th, you will not be allowed to park or Double Park in front of the 1760 building. There will be a move in crew to assist with transporting your belongings to your assigned room. All other times we appreciate you moving your car from these spaces to allow others to move in with ease.
- There will be paperwork provided for you to complete and return to the office in order to pick up your LIM College ID card and have access to your room and turnstiles.
- Although rooms are preassigned, we are unable to give you room #'s until you arrive @ check-in.
- Staff members will instruct you where to go once you arrive. There are parking garages nearby, however there is a fee to park.

By Subway/Train

From Grand Central Station:

Take the Lexington Avenue 6 train to 96th street. The 1760 building is located one block over between Lexington and Third Ave on 97th street

From Penn Station:

Take E uptown to 51st street and transfer to uptown 6 to 96th street

From Local Airports:

Shuttle services are available from JFK, Newark, LaGuardia, and Kennedy Airports for under \$50 per person

Bridges & Tunnel Tolls

From New Jersey

From Route 80 East take Keep LEFT to take I-80 EXPRESS LN E toward I-95/NEW JERSEY TURNPIKE/George Washington Bridge (toll)

Merge onto I-95 EXPRESS LN N/NEW JERSEY TURNPIKE N. -95 EXPRESS LN N/NEW JERSEY TURNPIKE N becomes I-95 N (Portions toll) (Crossing into NEW YORK).

Take the HARLEM RIV DR exit, EXIT 2, toward FDR DR

Merge onto HARLEM RIVER DR.

HARLEM RIVER DR becomes FDR DR S

Take EXIT 14 toward E 96 ST.

Stay STRAIGHT to go onto FDR DR/FRANKLIN D ROOSEVELT DR.

Turn RIGHT onto E 97TH ST.

Turn RIGHT onto 3RD AVE

-OR-

Take the Lincoln Tunnel (toll) to enter Midtown Manhattan at West 40th Street. Take Henry Hudson Parkway to West 96th Street and cross Central Park on 96th Street. Turn Left on Third Avenue

From Connecticut

From I-95 South Keep LEFT to take I-278 W via EXIT 6B toward TRIBORO BR.

Take the exit toward RANDALLS-WARDS IS/MANHATTAN/FDR DRIVE.

St Merge onto FDR DR S. ay STRAIGHT to go onto Robert F. Kennedy Bridge (formerly TRIBOROUGH BRIDGE) (toll)

Merge onto FDR DR S.

Take EXIT 14 toward E 96 ST.

Stay STRAIGHT to go onto FDR DR/FRANKLIN D ROOSEVELT DR.

Turn RIGHT onto E 97TH ST.

Turn RIGHT onto 3RD AVE.

From Upstate NY

Take I-87 to the Robert F. Kennedy Bridge (formerly Triboro Bridge) (toll). Take the FDR Drive Ramp and merge onto FDR Drive South.

Take EXIT 14 toward E 96 ST.

Stay STRAIGHT to go onto FDR DR/ FRANKLIN D ROOSEVELT DR.

Turn RIGHT onto E 97TH ST. Turn RIGHT onto 3RD AVE.

From Long Island

Take I- 278 East Take the exit toward MANHATTAN/RANDALLS-WARDS IS/DOWNING STADIUM.

Stay STRAIGHT to go onto Robert F Kennedy Bridge (formerly Triboro Bridge) (toll) Merge onto FDR DR S.

Take EXIT 14 toward E 96 ST

Stay STRAIGHT to go onto FDR DR/FRANKLIN D ROOSEVELT DR

Turn RIGHT onto E 97TH Street

Turn RIGHT onto 3RD AVE.

TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION

SIMPLY BUY YOUR METRO CARD RIGHT IN THE SUBWAY STATION WITH CASH, CREDIT, OR ATM CARD!



The fare for a single subway ride is \$2.50. The fare for an express bus ride is \$5.50

You can't buy a metrocard on the bus- make sure you have EXACT change!

✓ Pay-Per-Ride (regular) MetroCard:

Buy as many cards as you like from \$4 to \$89. Put \$8 or more on your MetroCard and receive a 15% bonus.

✓ 7-Day Unlimited Ride MetroCard

Cost = \$29

Good for unlimited subway and local bus rides until midnight, 7 days from the day of first use.

✓ 30-day Unlimited Ride MetroCard

Cost = \$104

Good for unlimited subway and local bus rides until midnight, 30 days from the first day of first use. This card is insured against loss when purchased at a vending machine with a credit or debit/ATM card.

✓ Remember to save your MetroCard – they can be refilled at the kiosk of most subway stations

ROOMMATE ISSUES!

One of the most exciting parts of transitioning into college is the prospect of living in a new place with new people and LIM College wants to prepare you to do this successfully. The first step is making the initial phone call, but what should you talk about?

Below you'll find some questions that involve issues that roommates should discuss to build a foundation of success through open communication. Please refer to the housing contract to see official rules on guests, alcohol, and other items to use as a guideline. ***You will be expected to complete a roommate agreement with your floor RA in the first few weeks of the semester to formally discuss these issues.***

One thing we don't recommend at Housing & Residence Life is to use online communities to find your roommate and decide "who they are" based on their pictures, likes & dislikes, or friend comments. **An online profile is indeed a piece of who they are, but may not perfectly illustrate their personality and background. Please remember to meet the person behind the profile!**

Remember that they're probably as nervous and excited as you are!

General:

- Where are you from?
- Any brothers, sisters, or pets?
- What clubs and activities did you participate in during HS?
- What are you interested in doing while you're here at LIM?
- What's your favorite store?

Guests:

- When is it OK to have guests over? Is there a difference between guests on weeknights verses weekends?
- How much advance warning is needed before I have a guest?
- Are there different rules for guests of the opposite gender?
- How should we go about asking for privacy in the room when we have a guest?

- How long can a guest stay with me?
- What happens if we both want to host a guest at the same time?
- What will we do if one of our guests damages each other's property?

Personal Property:

- What is OK to share? What is off-limits?
- How will we resolve an issue when something is touched without permission?

Common Area Items (*refrigerator, freezer, bathroom*)

- Will we share the cost of food? Will we share food at all?
- How often will we clean our microwave, refrigerator, and freezer?
- What will our bathroom cleaning schedule be?
- Who will buy the cleaning supplies and toilet paper?

Cleaning our Room:

- What's your idea clean? What do you consider messy?
- If my side of the room is messy, will that bother you?
- Where will we put dirty laundry?
- Will we share a trash can or keep small ones to ourselves?
- Should we create a weekly cleaning, tidying schedule?

Study and Quiet Time:

- When do you most like to study? Do you need complete quiet while you study?
- Do you fall asleep with the TV or music on? If you need noise to make you fall asleep, can you use headphones if it distracts me?
- Are you a late-night or a morning person?
- Do you need complete darkness to fall asleep?
- When is "lights out" in our room?

Telephone:

- Is there a time limit on how long one person can be on the phone in the room?
- Is it OK for your roommate to talk on the phone while you are sleeping or studying?
- Are there certain hours when friends shouldn't call?

Decorating the Room:

- How will we decorate our room?
- Are there items that we don't want on the walls? (Please see Housing Agreement/contract for acceptable use of tape, etc)

Disagreements:

- How will we handle disagreements?
- How will we discuss a broken agreement?
- How do I like to be addressed?

Other Issues:

- Is there anything else you need to know about each other?
- Is there anything you need your roommate to know about you?

Ask Yourself:

- If my roommate had an issue with me, how would I like to be approached?
- Should I be up front with my roommate, or communicate my issues via text or IM?
- Does digital communication allow for more interpretation than is appropriate in this situation?

Discussing these concerns up-front prevents a lot of potential hassle. Initially, you may agree to speak about issues as they arise but that is much harder to do once emotions become involved. At LIM College we encourage courtesy, communication, and compromise between roommates.

You don't need to be best friends with your roommate in order to live together, but it makes it a more enjoyable experience if you can get along with them. *If you need some help meeting a compromise or reaching resolution, we have RAs and an RD staffing the building to help you sort it out.*

1760 "What to Bring" List

Included in your residence hall room is: Twin bed and mattress, desk and chair, two short dressers, standing wardrobe, flat screen TV with DVD player, refrigerator with freezer, microwave. Rooms have private bathrooms with standard white shower liner. Rooms have tile floors and window blinds.

We strongly suggest that you talk to your roommate(s) when you are planning what to bring. We recommend that you bring only that which you cannot live without, as your room will fill up quickly. Remember you can always purchase additional items or have them sent after you move in. No items that interfere with fire safety equipment and laws are permitted.

- Pillow (1-2)

- Shower supplies (shampoo, conditioner, Body wash, etc.)
- Shower caddy
- Deodorant
- Toothbrush/ toothpaste
- Shaving supplies

Prohibited Items- (Leave at Home!)

- Tapestries
- Halogen lamps (fire hazard)
- Candles/Incense
- Flammable decorations (holiday lights, etc)
- Illegal substance of ANY kind
- Explosives, fireworks, smoke laden materials
- Pets (no fish, hamsters, reptiles, etc)
- Furniture of any kind including but not limited to couches, chairs, desks, tables or dressers
- Cooking appliances (George Foreman grill, toaster, hotpots, coffeemakers, rice cookers, blenders or ANY items with a hotplate)
- Alcohol or liquor of any kind. *We are a DRY residence hall.*
